Parish Council Agenda

Councillor Birbeck opened the meeting and welcomed Councillors.

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Borough Councillor Jamie McGowan reported on behalf of County Councillor Alan Hosker that the traffic lights on Manchester Road have been removed and the Hameldon Road pothole has been reported and is due to be repaired. There is a sunken gully on Manchester Road that needs repairing and complaints have been received about the Lengthsman making tire marks on the Recreation Ground, however, when work starts on the Pump Track this will get worse.

Jamie also provided a Borough Council report. A Full Council meeting was held in January and football pitches were discussed. It was noted that Hapton Parish Council does not receive any funds for the football pitch. Dog bins have been requested on the canal walk and there are no bins on the Blythe's estate. There is a campaign to help with 36 pitches across the Borough. All weather pitches are preferred but the cost is prohibitive.

The Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) is to be refreshed next year with line painting and lights being fixed. The current light is damaged and trips the Community Centre fuse box.

All the forms have been submitted for the Lancashire Environment Fund Grant and sent with the cheque. One more quote is needed from the Borough Council then the project can commence. The £70,000 track has been ordered which is 50m by 25m. Clark and Kent will take around 6 weeks to complete. The Council can either draw down 25% of the funding now or 50% when the work starts.

RESOLVED: That the Parish Council would draw down 50% of the funding on start of the project.

Lancashire Environment Fund have requested that the project is promoted and Jamie has produced a newspaper style leaflet that will delivered to every house in the Parish. This will outline the joint working between the Borough and Parish Councils. A press release is also to be sent and a Facebook video is being filmed at 1pm on Hapton Rec on Saturday. Clark and Kent will get involved in the official opening and will provide a professional cyclist.

The Borough Council budget is to be discussed at Council in 2 weeks and a 2.9% increase has been proposed.

The County has said they do not have the funds to stretch to 3 grit bins. The Parish Council agreed to fund the Valley Garden bin.

RESOLVED: That the Council will fund the grit bin at Valley Gardens on condition the County agree to fill it, this is approx. £250.

An update on the Number 9 bus was requested and a change to the national speed limit on Hameldon Road. IONOS does work on the website, it was therefore agreed to go with the new domain name. The nuisance bike signs are ongoing.

Councillor McGowan was thanked for his report.
