AM15/16/003 To receive reports from Community Organisations

PCSO Julie Rosthorn introduced herself to the meeting as the new Community Support Officer for Hapton. She outlined that she was previously stationed in Coal Clough with Deerplay and the Early Intervention Team.

Julie provided a Police Report that outlined there had been an increase in burglaries within a dwellings and not from a dwelling last month. There were 17 incidents of antisocial behaviour with issues on the allotments and parks. There were 7 incidents of personal disputes, 3 parking issues, a boisterous dog in a public area and 6 instances of youth nuisance on the allotment and parks. The burglaries were all in a similar area so it was thought these may be connected. There were 4 burglaries in a dwelling on Simpson Street/Wood Street, 4 other than in a dwelling on Simpson Street/Wordsworth Street/Wood Street and Harrow Close and 2 on the business parks. There were 5 damage to vehicles, 1 arson and one damage to a window as well as 2 thefts.

Pact priorities were agreed as:

- 1. Anti-Social Behaviour on allotments and parks;
- 2. Burglaries, with high visibility patrols;
- 3. Vehicle crime in Cambridge Drive area.

Residents in the Cambridge Drive area are looking to start a Neighbourhood Watch and will be provided with information.

Speeding bikes were reported down Mill Lane and Hambledon Road and slow signs were suggested. The County Councillor agreed to request a speed gun enforcement in the area.

Julie was thanked for her report.
